Featured Quilter



If you don't yet know the very delightful Joyce Spicer, you've been missing out! Let's fix that.

Joyce was born in Kankakee, Illinois and graduated from Rice Lake High School there. She lived in Minneapolis for 41 years before retiring to Florida in 2005, so this has been home for the last 14 years. Her mother was a quilter and Joyce recalls that she belonged to a Quilting Bee. Joyce, however, did not begin quilting until she was 35. She says she learned from books, classes, and from a special friend. Her first quilt was two sheets and some very fluffy batting which she sewed together and tied. Some of us have a similar memory!

Two years ago, she joined All Stars. She enjoys it so much, and we enjoy having her! Mostly she makes baby quilts and prayer quilts for her church group. The pocket

prayer quilt is small and simple, but just right for so many reasons! Joyce likes smaller projects that she can quilt by herself. Joyce also belonged to First Coast Quilt Guild for 12 years. She has entered quilts in the Clay County Fair.

Here's a chuckle that we doubt even some of her besties don't know about Joyce: she was only the second woman hired by McDonald's, in Minneapolis in 1967. (Perhaps she was the first to say, "You want fries with that?")!

We're looking for.....you?

I've been passing on Featured Quilters great stories for 7 years now. Before that, Vicki Zoller started the ball rolling and Linda Wilson took a turn. I do believe we need to pass the assignments around, and I've kept this one too long because I've enjoyed it so much. Now it is time for someone else to serve the guild and have fun doing it. It would be nice if someone who does not already have a service position would volunteer. I maintain it is the easiest task in the guild, and you don't have to attend any extra meetings or be anywhere. You do it from home at your convenience. You don't have to know anyone (but you'll get to know them!) Here's how it goes:

1. Choose a person to be your next Featured Quilter. I always say, everyone has a story—and I believe that! I get an idea for someone who shows a quilt at sew and tell, or I sit next to them at a sit and stitch or class, or I see their picture in the directory. Usually right after the general meeting I email them. Most are delighted!

2. The email says I'd like them to be a FQ. I have a list of questions (you can tweak my list any way you like) in the email and ask them to respond by email, or even hand write it out if they

prefer. I remind them the deadline is the first of the month, in time for the newsletter. I save my email so that I just cut and paste it each month. Takes 5 minutes tops!

3. When they respond I edit it slightly as necessary—mostly just making it third person. (“she”, not “I”). Dear Ellen, the newsletter editor, pulls the picture up for the newsletter if available, I don’t even have to do that. All I do is send Ellen my email interview before the beginning of the month. Takes me maybe 20 minutes.

4. At the General Meeting I announce the Featured Quilter and usually say a bit about her or ask the group what caught their eye when they read it. And they do read it! It has been a custom that we give the FQ a little something. Not necessary, but a nice gesture. I give them a mug rug, because that’s what I like making! It could be a store-bought star, a la All Stars (hmm, a star cookie cutter with a bow?) or a mini quilt like Joyce makes. Something quick and easy.

I know there’s someone (maybe more than one) person out there that would fit this opportunity to a T. Let me know at the meeting or my email (Lgm1249@gmail.com) or phone 904-651-7032.

UFO Challenge

At the September 21 All Stars Guild meeting, four members displayed ten completed UFOs.

Janice Martin completed three quilts: the first quilt was done in French colors and was a Small Group challenge quilt started in 2017. The second quilt was a study in half square triangles with a blue border started in the spring of 2015. The quilt was made to use up a stash of charm squares. Janice's third quilt, started in the fall of 2016, was a popcorn quilt made to use a three-yard bundle purchased at QuiltFest.

Sheri Harnack completed five quilts. The first quilt, started in 2015, and called Bricks and Stones was made from men's shirts. The second quilt, a black, yellow and white disappearing hourglass pattern was started in 2016. The third quilt, also started in 2016, was a scrappy Irish chain. Two other completed quilts, both started in 2017, were called Snaps and Pops and Stars and Trees (made from men's shirts).

Trish Egbert's completed quilt was called "Bright Stars Take 5." She said that she learned to make this quilt in a class taught by Betty Ann Agnew, and the quilt will become a Community Service Quilt.

Karen Weisman's completed quilt was Ballerinas. She purchased the unfinished quilt in 2015 from the Quilt Sale table at QuiltFest.

Remember that the criteria for UFOs are that the quilt should have been started in 2017 or earlier, and the UFO quilts should be completed when they are displayed. For each completed UFO you

enter, your name will be entered for a drawing that will take place at the end of the year (e.g., if you complete ten UFOs, your name will be entered ten times).

You still have time to take part in this activity. Mary Anne Dennis will have the forms you can use to list your UFOs at the September 16 Guild meeting. For each quilt you complete you will receive a sticker designed by Andrea Pellegrino. See how many stickers you can collect by the end of this challenge. We're looking forward to seeing the next group of UFOs completed by our talented members.
