### MINUTES of the OCT. GENERAL MEETING

#### All Star Quilters' Guild General Meeting Minutes October 16th, 2023

The meeting was called to order by President Sherry Verell at 10:00 A.M.

Sherry asked if there were any corrections to the September General Meeting Minutes.

There were none. Linda Harper made a motion to accept the minutes as published, Sandra Kaye seconded the motion.

Sherry read a letter from Pat D'Elia, thanking the guild for their hard work in making QuiltFest a success.

Sherry recognized that there has been a chair shortage at the church and stated she is working on it and it should be fine for the upcoming meeting.

Mary Anne Dennis read the **nominating committee's** nominations for

2024. President – Sherry Verell, Vice President – Raney Manning, Treasurer – Sharon Tomore, Recording Secretary – Donna Caldarise, Corresponding Secretary – Linda Harper. The vote will take place next month. Mary Anne stated that at that meeting, nominations can be taken from the floor (with the nominee's approval).

**Vice President/Programs** Raney Manning stated that the December meeting will be Florida Follies. Sign-ups for the January Birthday Party will take place at the next general meeting.

Today's program is Modern Quilts. The November General Meeting will be Sunnie's Log Cabin Chat.

**Treasurer** Sharon Tomore gave her Treasurer's report. The Beginning balance was \$18,065.20, Income totaled \$1,445.89, Expenses totaled \$18.22, The Ending balance was \$19.492.87.

Sheri stated that the guild collected \$1,090.00 from QuiltFest.

**Corresponding Secretary/Community Service** Terri Chamberlain stated that she sent cards to June Rittscher, Maureen Orr, Bonnie Helm, and Elaine Brett. Terri stated that last month \$1,165.00 in cash/check and food was donated to the Mandarin Food Bank. Nine quilts were donated to Pedscare, eight quilts to Harfelt and eleven quilts to daniel.

Next year the guild will start collecting pillowcases for Case for Smiles. The pillowcase directions and requirements are in the newsletter.

Sharon Buquo stated there will be another **Honor Flight** in April. Quilts will be needed before the March General Meeting.

**Education** Ellen Cannon stated that Demo Day will be the Monday after Thanksgiving starting at 10:00 AM. There will be 8 different Demonstrations.

Fall Retreat Sunnie stated that there are two openings left for Fall Retreat.

Sunnie has one spot open for the November General Meeting Log Cabin Chat, if you have a log cabin quilt let Sunnie know.

**Featured Quilter/QOV** Linda Marsh stated that this month's Featured Quilter is Debra Huisinga.

Last week Linda presented a QOV to an Air Force Veteran in Fleming Island. Next month Sandra Kaye will be presenting a QOV to an Army Veteran.

**Hospitality** Elfriede Echt thanked members who provided treats for the meeting. Elfriede passed around the sign-up sheets for November and December.

**Library** Vicki Zoller pulled 5 modern quilting books from the library if any members are interested.

**QuiltFest** Pat D'Elia stated that the nominations for next year are Pat D'Elia for President and Ellen Cannon for Treasurer. The Modern Quilt Guild will be part of Quilt-Fest starting next year.

Ellen Cannon stated that \$900.00 was raised from the friends of QuiltFest, ¾ of which came from All Stars Quilters' Guild.

Pat stated that 270 items were donated to the Silent Auction, all but 20 were sold. \$4,000.00 was donated to Community Hospice Pedscare Bereavement.

Seventy-eight baskets were donated to the Quilters Walk 1460 envelopes were sold, \$7300.00 less \$700 or \$800 in expenses, so each of the 6 guilds received \$1090.00.

Pat recognized Sondie Frus's hard work in attaining sponsors for QuiltFest.

The number of quilts available for sale was down from previous shows. 91% of the volunteer slots were filled, Pat thanked Patti Wallace and Candi Lennox

**Road Trip** Pat D'Elia stated that the road trip to the Ocala quilt show will be November 3rd. We will meet at the Target on San Jose unless other plans have been made. The sign-up sheet has been circulated.

**Sit 'n Stitch** Mary Anne Dennis is looking for a volunteer to help her with Sit 'n Stitch for next year. LeighAnn McGuigan volunteered. Trish Egbert stated that there will be a Sit 'n Stitch on October 30th, November 13th and December 11th. Trish thanked members who helped out with the community service 16 patch blocks.

**Utility Bags/UFOs** Mary Anne Dennis stated that the bags are sorted and ready to go to DEFC, Hubbard House and Safe Harbor. More bags are available to sew. UFO's are ongoing.

**Membership** Susan Sharpe thanked Bobbie Redshaw and Sheron Walser for their help. 2024 renewals start in November. Renewal Emails will go out shortly and Susan requests that you print out the attached form and make any necessary changes. Early bird sign-ups will be in November and December. Susan has no volunteers for the greeter program for November and December, so she will be asking greeters as needed. She will address tee shirts in December or January.

At our meeting today there were 3 guests, 7 new members and 83 members present. We now have a total of 186 members.

The winners of the drawing were Candi Lennox and Sue Blythe

**Website** Pris Roehm stated that if you aren't getting the eblasts let her know (remember to check your spam folder first).

**Program** Raney Manning introduced Candi Lennox from the Modern Quilt Guild **Show 'n Tell** Pris Roehm for Susan Kingston 6 members shared their quilts.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:50.

#### From the President


