MINUTES of the NOV. GENERAL MEETING

The meeting was called to order by President Sherry Verell at 10:03 AM.

Sherry asked if there were any corrections to the October General Meeting Minutes.

There were none. Mary Ann Dennis made a motion to accept the minutes as published. Ann Carraway seconded the motion.

Sherry announced that the Jelly Roll Quilts that were worked on at Fall Retreat will be shown at the February General Meeting.

Sherry thanked Karol Blomgren for making the picture board of AllStar's quilts at Quilt-Fest

Sherry invited members to attend our Board Meetings.

Vice President/**Programs** Raney Manning invited members to sign-up for our January Birthday Party. Our December program will be Flamingo Follies, Raney still has one Flamingo to be decorated if anyone is interested.

Treasurer Sharon Tomore gave her treasurers report. The opening balance was \$11,386.99, income totaled \$612.61, expenses totaled \$2,530.07, the ending balance was \$9,469.53.

Sharon announced that we will be discontinuing the use of the "Square" as it is not cost effective to the guild.

Corresponding Secretary/Community Service Terri Chamberlain stated that she sent cards to Jean Newton, Carol Burd, Bonnie Taylor, Sue Blythe, Maureen Orr and Melinda Rials. She also sent a card (with the check) to Isiah House and a Thank You card to Dr. Allen Nathan for the donation of fabric and quilting equipment.

Terri announced that there will be a pillowcase workshop at the January 29th Sit 'n Stitch.

The guild collected \$200 worth of food and \$1,143.00 in cash and checks for a total of \$1,343.00 for the **Mandarin Food Bank**.

Election of Officers Mary Anne Dennis listed the Slate of Officers. President Sherry Verell, Vice President Raney Manning, Treasurer Sharon Tomore, Recording Secretary Donna Caldarise, and Corresponding Secretary Linda Harper. Mary Anne asked if there were any nominations from the floor. There were none. Sunnie Malesky made a motion to accept the Slate of Officers, Stacey Wilson seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

Education Ellen Cannon stated that Demo Day will be November 27 th at 10:00AM. Sign-ups for the February 26th Collage Class began today - Class \$10, Pattern and Fabric \$16.

Quits of Valor Linda Marsh and Sandra Kaye presented member Sheila Schuler with a Quilt of Valor. Samantha Howell joined Quilts of Valor and did her first presentation last month. There is a need for donations of quilts for Quilts of Valor.

Hospitality Elfrieda Echt thanked members who brought today's goodies. Sign-up sheets were circulated for cookies and cupcakes.

Featured Quilter Linda Marsh announced that Diane Hutsell is this month Featured Quilter.

Membership Susan Sharpe stated that we have 94 members and 3 visitors present. We now have 187 members. Susan thanked members who filled out their re-

newal forms and renewed their membership. The drawing winners were Susan Kingston, Gloria Hart, Nena Bird and Janet Brown.

Sit 'n Stitch Trish Egbert stated that the last Sit 'n Stitch for this year will be December 11 th . Mary Anne Dennis and LeighAnn McGuigan will be taking over Sit 'n Stitch next year.
