#### MINUTES of the APRIL GENERAL MEETING

All Star Quilters' Guild General Meeting April 17th, 2023 The meeting was called to order by President Sherry Verell at 10:00AM.

Sherry asked if there were any corrections to the March General Meeting Minutes. There were none. Linda Harper made a motion to accept the minutes as published, Adriane Elwood seconded the motion.

**Vice President/Programs** Raney Manning announced that the May program will be Linda Sill from Creative Quilting. Raney is working on the June program. She is open to suggestions.

**Treasurer** Sharon Tomore gave her treasurer's report. The opening balance on 4/3/23 was \$9,600.95. The income totaled \$399.76. The expenses totaled \$767.39. The ending balance was \$9,233.32.

**Corresponding Secretary/Community Service** Terri Chamberlain stated that she sent out 4 cards this month. She thanked the guild members for the quilts they have donated

Sunnie Malesky shared her Mystery Bag Project. The mystery bags will contain enough fabric to make a quilt for Hartfelt. The bags will be given out in May and due back in August.

**Road Trips** Pat D'Elia sent around a sign-up sheet for a road trip to Cut Up and Sew on May 12th . The Target on San Jose will be the meeting place, (at 9:00AM).

**Education** Vondy Hilbert explained details about her Featherweight Maintenance class which will be on July 24th . Ellen Cannon stated the Collage Quilt class will be May 22nd and 23 rd . In August there will be a class given by Petting Fabrics.

**Featured Quilter** Sherry Verell (for Linda Marsh) stated that Samantha Howell was this months Featured Quilter.

**Hospitality** Elfriede Echt thanked the members who supplied today's snacks. She passed around the sign-up sheet for June and July.

**Library/Challenge** Vicki Zoller pulled books that use precuts, which may be of interest to members who purchased precuts today.

**Recycle is the challenge theme**. The reveal is July. Vicki suggested if you make your Challenge quilt 24"x24" or smaller, you may want to donate it to QuiltFest.

**Quilters' Walk** Deborah Pearce explained the two baskets for Quilters' Walk. Donations of sewing tools will fill one basket, and donations of games will fill the other basket.

**QuiltFest** Pat D'Elia shared with the guild that the "Sew"cial at Cinnamons was a success. Pat went on to explain what QuiltFest is all about. If you have any questions contact Pat. Pat thanked Sondie Frus for obtaining sponsorships from AQS and Handiquilter.

**QuiltFest Volunteers** Patty Wallace encouraged members to sign up to volunteer at QuiltFest. She will have the sign-up sheets before and after the General Meetings starting in July.

**Membership** Susan Sharpe stated that we have 82 members and8 guests present. Liz Staley and Sunnie Malesky were the winners of the door prizes. Susan thanked Sondie Frus for making the power point presentation to view the T shirts in different colors.

Susan also thanked Joanne Herman for recommending the T-shirt company, J and J Designs. Susan passed around the sign-up sheetfor the T-shirts.

**Sit 'n Stitch** Trish Egbert stated that Mary Anne Dennis did a great job with her 4 Patch Posie demonstration.

May 8th Linda McClelland will do a quilt as you go demonstration.

On May 29th Trish will introduce a new 16 patch quilt design. She is collecting blue stars until Spring Retreat. The patterns are on the website.

In June Mary Anne will give information about quilt backings.

**UFO's/Utility Bags** Mary Anne Dennis reminded the guild that quilts started in 2021 or earlier qualify as a UFO. Don't forget to have your UFO card punched. After 5 punches you get a gift, after 10 punches your get a gift card to a quilt shop.

Kelly Ashline is our Featured Quilter for May! She was born in Michigan, but spent most of her youth in Massachusetts. She has also lived in Mexico, Virginia, Texas, Maine, Panama, Guam, and of course, Florida (11 years).

Kelly began quilting about 3 years ago by teaching herself and watching lots of videos. Kelly is married, mom to 4 children, and grandmother to 2 grandchildren with a 3rd on the way. She and her husband both retired from the Navy in June of 2022, and are loving retired life.

Kelly's first quilt was made from a pattern given to her by her sister-in-law. It was a simple square pattern for a baby

quilt and taught her how to quilt by stitching in the ditch. She enjoyed it so much, that's all it took to hook her on quilting. Kelly has been a member of All Stars for a few months, and was invited to a meeting by member Gloria Hart. She spent some time volunteering last year at QuiltFest during the quilt judging.

Kelly has been learning to paper-piece quilts and recently completed her first Judy Neimeyer quilt (Dinner Plate Dahlia, photo below). She owns a long arm and enjoys

developing her free motion quilting skills on the long arm machine.

Kelly says "The second quilt I ever made was for my daughter and she picked a pattern from AccuQuilt, which said the pattern was free, but I didn't realize that it only worked with their cutting tool. I had to figure out how to make the cuts without the tool. It was my first attempt at doing anything more complicated than squares and boy did I learn a lot, and made a ton of mistakes. It was also the first quilt I quilted doing something other than stitching in the ditch. I am hoping to eventually redo this quilt now that I have learned so much."



In addition to quilting, Kelly enjoys walking the beach, working in the yard, and reading. Something most people don't know about Kelly is that Spanish is Kelly's native language. She was living in Mexico when she first learned to talk, and when her family moved back to the US, she did not speak any English.

Plans for the September 14-16, 2023 show are coming together nicely. Here are some highlights from the most recent QuiltFest meeting.

1. Items other than, but including, small quilts will be accepted for donation into **Silent Auction**.

Thanks to everybody at the April meeting who took a little kit for making blue stars or sixteen patch blocks. Please get you stars to Trish by the May meeting. She plans to put the quilt together at Spring Retreat. She will be collecting sixteen patch blocks for the next several months. There are a number of patterns for using them that Trish will be providing in future

.

At Sit 'n Stitch on May 8, the demo is Linda McClelland presenting a quilt-as-you-go technique. If you want to practice your newfound knowledge, bring your machine with the usual sewing supplies along with cutting board and equipment. We will have batting. We also have fabric, or you can bring your own.

For May 29, our fifth Monday Community Service Sit 'n Stitch, Trish will debut a new pattern using the sixteen patch blocks we have been working on. This pattern also requires 2-1/2" white squares and 2-1/2" half square triangle units (half print, half white). ("White" includes ivory, cream, beige, off-white, very pale pastels, even scattered prints on white—whatever reads lighter in color than most prints.)

Previewing future activities, a **demo on backing is planned for June 13**. Details later

Bring your own project, or come join Trish's never-ending work with scraps. Whether there is a demo or not, there is always a space for you to do your own work and enjoy the company of other quilters who love it as much as you do
