# MINUTES of the MAY GENERAL MEETING

The meeting was called to order by President Sherry Verell at 10:00 AM. Sherry thanked Susan Sharpe for handling the guild Tee Shirt orders. She also thanked Pat D'Elia for the recent road trip to Cut Up and Sew. Sherry asked if there were any corrections to the April General Meeting Minutes. There were none. Linda Harper made a motion to accept the minutes as published, Betty Olson seconded the motion.

**Vice President/Programs** Raney Manning announced that today's program is Trunk show with Linda Sill from Creative Quilting. June's program is still tentative. July will be the challenge quilts with Vicky Zoller. Raney is talking with Susan Ache about a possible program in August.

**Corresponding Secretary/Community Service** Terri Chamberlain stated that she sent out 3 cards this month. Terri shared that the guild donated 11 quilts to Hartfelt and 1 quilt to Safe Harbor. In June the guild will be collecting donations for the Mandarin Food Pantry. Sharon Buquo shared with the guild that there will be another Honor Flight in September and she will be looking for quilts to be donated. Sunnie Malesky thanked members who picked up a Mystery Bag, there are still bags available. If you finish your quilt by August, you may be eligible for a prize.

**Education** Ellen Cannon stated that we still have spots available for Featherweight Class. Ellen is working on setting up a class with Georgiana Lewis. Demo day will be November 27th, Ellen is still looking for demonstrators.

**Featured Quilter/Quilts of Valor** Linda Marsh stated that Kelly Ashline is this month's Featured Quilter.

Linda received a Quilts of Valor Quilt from Community Service. Linda is working with Sandra Kaye on making a Quilts of Valor presentation. Barbara Nichols stated that she made a presentation. Samantha Howell will be taking Barbara's place as a Quilts of Valor presenter.

**Treasurer** Sharon Tomore gave her Treasurer's report. The opening balance on 5/1/2023 was \$8,435.12. The income totaled \$134.14. The expenses totaled \$2,355.47. The ending balance was \$6,213.79. Sharon thanked members for their patience in using the "Square".

**Newsletter** Sunnie Malesky reminded the guild that the first Monday of the month is the deadline for the newsletter.

**Publicity/QuiltFest** Sondie Frus shared that there is an article about the donations the guild makes to the Mandarin Food Bank in the Mandarin Newsline. Sondie shared the poster and bookmarks for QuiltFest. She encouraged guild members to share the posters with businesses and the bookmarks with friends and family. QuiltFest will be selling pins and tote bags this year. Last year QuiltFest spent \$80,000 dollars before the doors were open. Advance tickets will be available through Ticketmaster on June 1st (there will be a surcharge). Advance tickets will also be available at Cinnamon's Quilt Shop, Bee's Quilt Shop and Titled Quilter on August 1st (cash only). They will also be available at quilt take in. Friends of QuiltFest will be available next month for \$5.00. The 2024 theme will be "Sew Your Heart Out"

**Membership** Susan Sharpe stated that there are 96 members present, 2 guests and 1 new member. There are now 165 members. The guild sold 101 Tee shirts. Toni Anweiler and Daphne Moerler were the drawing winners.

**Quilter's Walk/Quilt Raffle** Linda McClelland passed around an article explain-

ing Quilter's Walk. The information is also in the newsletter.  
Raffle tickets are available.

**Sit 'n Stitch** Trish Egbert stated that Linda McClelland gave a terrific demo on "Quilt as you go". Trish shared a Hartfelt quilt she made from donated blocks.

On May 29th Trish will share a new pattern that uses a 16 patch blocks.

On June 12<sup>th</sup> Mary Anne Dennis will present ideas for backings. Trish reminded the guild that you can always bring your own project even when there is a demo. There will be another Sit 'n Stitch on June 26th .

**Utility Bags/UFOs** Mary Anne Dennis is still collecting utility bags and there are precut kits available.

Mary Anne presented Sharon Buquo with a gift certificate for being the first member to finish 10 UFOs.

Spring Retreat Sherry Verell reminded the guild that Spring Retreat is this Wednesday to Friday, if you have not received your information packet see Elaine Brett.

**QuiltFest Volunteers** Patty Wallace reminded the guild that volunteers are needed. Sign ups will begin in July. Sheila Schuler will be helping Patty with the sign ups.

**Program** Raney Manning introduced Linda Sill

**Show 'n Tell** Susan Kingston 10 members shared their quilts.

Dimensions of the frame: 54" wide x 32"-42" height (for sitting or standing) x 37"-42" depth (for accommodating a domestic machine through 19' longarm.

Frame height and depth are both adjustable for sitting or standing to stitch.

\*With this frame you can quilt placemats through King size(and larger) quilts! You can slide the quilt left and right to accommodate the width of your quilt and advance rows from front to back of the frame for the length of your quilt.

\*I have the original box and packing for the Q'nique 15 PRO

\*You will need to take it down so you know how to put it back up. I will assist with take down.
