MINUTES of the JULY GENERAL MEETING

All Star Quilters' guild General Meeting July 17 th, 2023

The meeting was called to order by President Sherry Verell at 10:00 AM.

Sherry asked if there were any corrections to the June General Meeting Minutes.

There were none. Barbara Nichols made a motion to accept the minutes as published, Mary Anne Dennis seconded the motion.

Sherry announced that we need a table coordinator for the All Star Quilters' Guild QuiltFest table.

Sherry thanked Patty Wallace and Terri Chamberlain for raising \$100.00 for ways and means with the sale of the fabric bundles last month.

Vice President/**Programs** Sunnie Malesky for Raney Manning announced that the August program will be the Mystery Bag Quilt reveal. Sunnie thanked members for participating and reminded them to bring their quilts next month (please be early if you can). Patty Wallace suggested that the Mystery Bag Quilt program become an annual event.

Treasurer Sharon Tomore gave the treasurer's report. The beginning balance was \$8,067.61, income totaled \$1,365.00, expenses totaled \$359.58, the ending balance was \$9,073.03.

Corresponding Secretary/Community Service Terri Chamberlain sent out one card this month. Terri thanked members for their Christmas in July purchases.

There were 13 quilts donated to daniel, 15 quilts to Hartfelt and 1 quilt to Safe Harbor. So far this year the guild has donated 135 quilts (the same number as this time last year). Terri thanked members for the generosity.

Education Pris Roehm stated that the two upcoming workshops are full. She thanked members for signing up. She encouraged members to keep coming to workshops.

Fall Retreat Sunnie Malesky stated that there are still spaces available for fall retreat. **Featured Quilter/QOV** Linda Marsh stated that the July Featured Quilter was Susan Kingston.

Linda had to reschedule her QOV planned presentation.

Hospitality Elfriede Echt passed around the refreshment sign-up sheet for August and September.

Library Vicki Zoller stated that the library will be open next month. Next month there will be some books for sale for \$1.00.

Membership Susan Sharpe stated that there are 83 members, 1 new member and 3 guests present. We now have 172 members.

Leslie Moeller and Linda Harper were the drawing winners for July.

Newsletter Sunnie Malesky stated that the newsletter is available on the website. There are a few paper copies available at the free table.

Quilter's Walk/Raffle Tickets Linda McClelland stated that the baskets are just about complete, if you have any additions to the baskets let Linda or Deborah Pearce know. To date 500 raffle tickets have been sold. Next month Linda will not be here, Karol Blomgren will fill in for her.

QuiltFest Pat D'Elia stated that quilt registration numbers seem to be low. Registration is open until July 25 th .

Pat is accepting Silent Auction donations.

Pat explained how the Quilt Sale Room works. Forms will be available next month.

15% of sale proceeds go to QuiltFest.

Ellen Cannon requested that members sign up for Friends of QuiltFest.

Sit 'n Stitch Trish Egbert stated that the July 31st Sit 'n Stitch will be designated to work on the QuiltFest giveaways, cord wraps. Bring your sewing machine. August 14th will be a regular Sit 'n Stitch.

Utility Bags/UFOs Mary Anne Dennis stated that Utility Bags and UFOs are ongoing. **QuiltFest Volunteers** Patty Wallace stated she will have hot dogs and soft drinks available for those who participate in the cord wrap Sit 'n Stitch. She encouraged members to continue to sign up to volunteer for QuiltFest. If you have issues with the "Sign Up Genius" let her know. If you are unsure of the duties involved in volunteering, Patty will pair you up with a veteran volunteer!

Program The Challenge (with Vicki Zoller) winners were Marita Eng, Deb Frain and Mary Anne Dennis.

Show 'n Tell Susan Kingston Five members shared their quilts.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:25 AM.

Q'nique 15 PRO Longarm with Stitch Regulation and Q-Zone Hoop Frame Pro version

I purchased this machine and frame new in in July 2020. It has a 15" deep x 10" high Harp and both front and rear handles, each with its own independent 2.5" color touch-screen display.

Overall dimensions of the machine are 23" long x 15.5" wide x 18" high.

Stitch count: 1699263

Extras included.

Dimensions of the frame: 54" wide x 32"-42" height (for sitting or standing) x 37"-42" depth (for accommodating a domestic machine through 19' longarm.

Frame height and depth are both adjustable for sitting or standing to stitch.

*With this frame you can quilt placemats through King size(and larger) quilts! You can slide the quilt left and right to accommodate the width of your quilt and advance rows from front to back of the frame for the length of your quilt.

*I have the original box and packing for the Q'nique 15 PRO

*You will need to take it down so you know how to put it back up. I will assist with take down.
