MINUTES of the MARCH GENERAL MEETING

All Star Quilters' Guild General Meeting March 20th, 2023

The meeting was called to order by President Sherry Verell at 10:00AM.

Sherry thanked Sharon Tomore for getting the guild another "Square" and for updating the guild's brochure.

Sherry asked if there were any corrections to the February General Meeting Minutes. There were none. Mary Anne Dennis made a motion to accept the minutes as published, Linda Marsh seconded the motion.

Sherry stated that we will vote on which charity will receive our raffle quilt proceeds. Samantha Howell (for Raney Manning) told the guild about Foster Closet. Pat D'Elia told the guild about Vision Education and Rehabilitation. And Linda McClelland told the guild about Isaiah 117. Ballots were circulated and results will be announced later in the meeting.

Sherry announced that she and Sunnie Malesky will be co-chairs for the

Fall Retreat. The planning meeting is April 3rd, right after the board meeting.

Sherry announced that there are still openings for the Spring Retreat, sign up after the meeting.

Vice President/Programs Sherry Verell (for Raney Manning) announced that the April program will be Deb Strain from Moda. The May meeting will be Linda Sill from Creative Quilting.

Treasurer Sharon Tomore gave her treasurer's report. The 3/6/23 opening balance was \$10,006.03, income totaled \$1,407.32, expenses

totaled \$241. 20 and the ending balance was \$11,172.15.

Corresponding Secretary/Community Service Terri Chamberlain stated that she sent no cards out this month.

30 quilts were donated to daniel Kids. 5 quilts went to Safe Harbor. 121 Utility bags were donated to three charities. Hartfelt would appreciate donations of lap size quilts, they service 200 new senior each year.

Education Pris Roehm stated that Mable Holiman's table runner class will be April 10th and April 24th . The collage quilt class will be May 22nd and 23rd .

Website Pris Roehm reminded the guild of the new email address.

Featured Quilter Linda Marsh stated that Karen Pasiuk is the featured quilter.

Hospitality Elfriede Echt thanked the members who supplied today's snacks. She passed around the sign up sheet for April and May.

Library/Challenge Vicki Zoller encouraged the guild to take advantage of our library. Email Vicki if you are looking for something specific.

The theme for the Challenge is "Recycle". The reveal will be in July.

Newsletter Sunnie Malesky reminded the guild that the newsletter is available 24/7 on the website.

Food Bank Vondy Hilbert shared with the guild that she collected \$716 in cash and checks and another \$350 in food, for a total of \$1066. Sondie Frus went with Vondy to deliver the food and took pictures.

QuiltFest/Road Trips Pat D'Elia reminded the guild about the April 15 th event at Cinnamons. There will be a QuiltFest meeting at the church on Tuesday at 6:30. (not the usual meeting place) The QuiltFest theme will be "Sew Full of Whimsey" and will take place September 14th — 16 th. Quilts are needed for the Silent Auction.

Pedscare Hospice will be the recipient of the auction proceeds.

Pat stated that the guild spent \$300 on the Daytona trip and everyone had

a good time. Please send Pat suggestions for future road trips.

Ways and Means QuiltFest Ellen Cannon explained that Quiltfest needs sponsors for the prizes. Companies or individuals can be sponsors and sponsorships range from \$100 to \$300. They also need companies or individuals to place ads which start at \$25. More information will follow to be a friend of QuiltFest.

Sit 'n Stitch Trish Egbert stated that on March 27th Mary Anne Dennis will demonstrate the 4 Patch Posie. There will be no Sit 'n Stitch in April. On May 8th Linda McClelland will give a guilt as you go demonstration. On May 29th Trish will introduce a new 16 patch quilt design. She is collecting blue stars until Spring Retreat. The pattern is on the website. Trish reminded the guild that it is National Quilting Month and encouraged members to celebrate it. Let her know what you do to celebrate.

Utility Bags/UFOs Mary Anne Dennis she is still sewing and collecting bags. She has precut bags available.

She reminded the guild to be sure to let her know when you Show 'n Tell a UFO.

Raffle Quilt The votes were tallied and Isaiah 117 will be the recipient of the proceeds.

Membership Susan Sharpe stated that we have one new member, 89 members present and we now have a total of 161 members. Susan thanked Karen Duffy and Laura Rowe for being greeters.

Sherry Verell and Sue Blythe were the winners of the door prizes.

Susan shared her idea of having a guild T shirt. We will be choosing a logo at the board meeting.

Program Sherry (for Raney Manning) introduced Sue Hurley, Quilting with Rulers.

Show 'n Tell Delia Bright (for Susan Kingston) 12 members shared their guilts.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:05 PM

The 16-patch blocks should be as scrappy as you like. This quilt will be put together at spring retreat. Afterwards, we'll start a new pattern with the 16-patch blocks (but no stars).
