

Please arrive with your quilt between 9:00 and 9:30. This gives me time to arrange the quilts before the meeting starts. And remember— your quilt should be 36" square. I realize that shrinkage often takes place after quilting, but not 3 or 4 inches! So take care. If you wish to provide information about your quilt (much like you would for a QuiltFest entry), please provide your info on a piece of paper or card no larger than 3" x 5" and affix it to your quilt. If your name is anywhere on your quilt, please cover it up.

During the program part of the meeting, we will view the quilts and vote on our 3 favorites. I will provide some pencils, but they always seem to vanish, so you might want to bring your own. Each quilt will then tell a bit about his or her entry. This is so much fun, as we always enjoy hearing the stories behind the quilts, and we also reveal who made each quilt. After the votes are tallied, the top 3 vote getters' names will be announced and they will each receive a \$40 gift card from Cinnamon's.

Happy Quilting! I can't wait to see your quilts!

I asked Sunnie Maleski, who was President at the time, if I could write a column shining a light on various members of the Guild and she said yes. Since 2010 there have been 150 Featured Quilters!

Interviews have been conducted by me, Linda McClelland, Lisa Anderson, June Rittscher, Susan Sharpe, Donna Calderise, and Linda Marsh. Linda McClelland conducted a whopping 66 interviews!

Here is the appeal. If you would like to be a Featured Quilter, let me know via phone or email. Or if you would like to nominate a fellow Guild member to be a Featured quilter, let me know. Generally, I email a list of questions and the Guild member responds via email. But if you would prefer to meet face to face, we can arrange that. Do not feel that you need to respond to every question. You may share information about your personal life or you can focus on your quilting journey. Maybe you are an experienced quilter or maybe you haven't completed a quilt. It doesn't matter! You can share whatever you want— such as what brought you to All Stars or what you enjoy about belonging to the Guild.

People I have interviewed have often said, "Oh, there is nothing interesting about me." Not true! Every person I interviewed had something interesting and unique to share. The first person I interviewed, Julie Mainor, added a question to my list, "Is there something about you that most people don't know?" There have been some amazing answers to that question.





General Meeting Minutes June 16, 2025 (Draft)

President Delia Bright called the meeting to order at 10:00 am

President Delia asked that the May General Meeting Minutes to be approved. Angela Moore made a motion to approve the minutes and Jill Kelly seconded. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

We are selling tickets for the Raffle Quilt that is here on display so we can take a picture to show when selling the tickets. The quilt was pieced by Mary Anne Dennis and quilted by Delia Bright.

Vice President Pat D'elia - Programming – The Mystery Program has been postponed. It will continue to be a mystery. We will instead have an extended Show & Tell.

Upcoming programs are:

July – Challenge Reveal – Vicki Zoller will talk about that.

August – Nikki Hill is from St. Augustine, and she is an award-winning quilter at our show and at the AQS Shows. She will show us some beautiful, primitive items.

For those who will be participating in our extended Show & Tell, if you want your picture taken, take a number when you sign the register. If you do not want your picture taken, do not take a number.

Treasurer -Martha Hann – is not here today. Delia Bright will give the report for Martha.

Beginning Balance 11,480.58, Class fees, Fabric Sales and Raffle Tickets 1,010.00, Final Balance12,490.58

Corresponding Secretary – Linda Harper – 43 cards were sent out this month. Some cards were sent out to some just so they know we were thinking about them. Cards were sent to June Daniels, Randy Powers, Nancy Moran, Patty Wallace, Terri Paglione, Linda Marsh, Nena Bird and Sharon Tomore.

Community Service – Joann Davenport – Food Bank – Gloria is on the way to drop off things that were donated. We had \$640.00 in cash and checks, and \$417.00 in food and paper goods. The Food Bank needs jelly.

Fabric Table – If you want something from Community Service for a quilt that you are working on, those items are free. We just got a roll of batting, so if you need some see Sharon Buquo or Joann and they will give it to you. Randy Powers asked that we be reminded that no labels are needed for the Community Service quilts because we iron those on. If you need a Community Service quilt quilted or bound, we have people that will assist you with that.

Education – Jill Kelly – There are some slots available for the Paper Piecing Class because she has increased the size of the July class. Sign-up sheets are on the table. The August Painting class is closed, no one has cancelled so the waiting list is still waiting. Jill will ask if she'll be willing to come back after the first of the year to teach another class.

We have Demo Day planned for November 10. Jill passed around the sign-up sheet. She needs only 6 or 7 people to Demo a tip, or special way that they do something, or a pattern that they think somebody would like. Each Demo lasts only 15 or 20 minutes, then we rotate from table to table.

Christmas Tree Skirt – Mary Anne Dennis – there are more slots open. For those that have already signed up, the pattern is on the table, in the paper bags.

Fall Retreat – Sherry Verrell – The Fall Retreat is coming up October 27 – 31. It will be at the Conference Center in Silver Springs. Our first planning meeting is today, 21 June 2025. If you are participating in, or are interested in helping plan, you are welcome to come to the meeting.

Featured Quilter – Vicki Zoller – Linda Marsh is stepping away for a while so Vicki will be doing the Featured Quilter for a while. Featured Quilter started as a monthly column in 2010. Linda gave Vicki a list of everyone who has been interviewed for the Featured Quilter. We have featured a lot of Quilters, and we currently have two people that are lined up to be interviewed. If you would like to be interviewed or if you have someone that you would like to recommend being interviewed, email Vicki. She has a list of questions, and you can decide what you would like to have included in the column. It can be done by email. You do not need to be an experienced quilter. It isn't about that. It's about getting to know everyone in the guild.

Linda Marsh wrote: The June Featured Quilter is Diana Oliver. She was born into a Military family, and her first move was when she was just 10 days old. She has lived in over 50 different locations and has called Jacksonville home for the past 30 years. She first sewed satin together as a teenager in her first attempt to make a quilt. It was never finished. While she was between jobs, she took a quilting class at FSCJ and made several quilts before returning to the workforce. Her instructor at FSCJ, Gay Montgomery, mentioned All Star Quilters' Guild. She retired 2 or 3 years ago. And about 3 years ago Diana stopped at the All Star Quilters' table at QuiltFest and joined the guild. She was pleasantly surprised at the professional structure of the All Star Quilters' Guild and the friendliness of the members. Diana showed several of her quilts to the membership.

Hospitality – Terri Chamberlain asked for volunteers for July. Terri and Linda have been trying to step into Elfriede Echt's shoes while she's on a cruise. We have one spot open for July. Terri is trying to fill in that spot for Elfriede. Michael Martiss volunteered to bring something for the table in July.

Library – Vicki Zoller – Next month, library will be closed because we need that area to do the Challenge quilts. The library will be back in August.

Challenge is next month (July) and all the information is in the newsletter. There will be more specific information in next month's newsletter. She has asked that the quilts are here by 9:15 am so everything can be set up beforehand. The only rule for the Challenge quilt, is that they must be 36" x 36".

Membership – Susan Sharpe – We have 90 people here today and we have 156 Members as of today. We have a new member, Katie Elkman. We have 2 visitors, Vonda Emery, guest of Cindy McGee, and Tahitiana Rivera, guest of Kathy Nay.

Membership drawing winners are Deb Frain and Elaine Brett.

T-Shirts – Susan is getting the order ready. The shirts are \$20 due upon delivery and hopefully that will be at the July meeting. Susan would like to get the order to Trisha Gros, all filled out. The company we're using has been very kind to us. She asked if there was anyone else that wants a shirt, but didn't get to order yet. There were 5 people that wanted to place orders. Susan asked that they see her after this meeting.

Susan oversees judging. She encouraged anyone that has the time to go to the judging because you learn so much. Not that you must make quilts according to what the judges say, but you'll see what they look for and you'll know if you want to enter a quilt. She said not to worry about that. There are 17 slots open in the morning and afternoon. We're not filled yet. She asked us

to go online and check it out. Judging is the week before QuiltFest, and it usually ends on Thursday. But they've set aside Friday also. So – sign up!

Passion Projects – C.J. Clark – She and Beth Sullivan are members of Bag Ladies & they take donations for The Hubbard House, which is for victims of domestic violence, it is a safe haven. We can help them with Publix Prescription bags. They put toiletries in the bags for the children. The Bag Ladies give 45 bags per month to children at the Hubbard House. These children come in with the clothes on their backs, in the middle of the night, scared to death. The Bag Ladies fill the bags with a towel, wash cloth, a pillow, Beanie babies, a small toy, flashlight, toiletries and children's books. They need a lot of donations such as brushes, combs, soap, shampoo, etc. These can be given to C.J. or to Beth. They currently have enough for the rest of this year. But they never turn down any donations. They also take larger stuffed animals that will fit in the bags.

Raffle Quilt – Deborah Pearce – Raffle quilt ticket sales – she has a picture of the quilt, and it is amazing. About one third of the members have bought or picked up envelopes of the tickets. If every one of us takes 1 envelope, that would be over \$3000 for the Volunteers in Medicine. You can look online and see all the good things they do. Come by and pick up your tickets.

QuiltFest – President Delia – we have several points that we would like to touch on. The **Boutique** – Deb Frain, **Baskets** – Rainy Manning, **Volunteers** – Jenny Chambless, and **Quilt Sale Room** – LeighAnn McGuigan.

QuiltFest – Pat D'Elia - Registration for quilts is now open. It opened in April and will end on July 25. She does not have current count, but the last time she heard there were 14 entries. You do not have to have the quilt finished until the September 1 turn in. But you do have to have it registered. They need to know the number of entries they have so they can plan the layout. So, register as soon as you know what you're doing. If you go ahead and register, you won't need to worry about it. Just finish in time for turn in. There is a lot to do between registration and turn in. There are turn in sites and there is a lot of paperwork that needs to be completed and turned into different sites.

QuiltFest is asking that instead of Me Dolls (we have enough sewn up, ready to stuff), they want/need Heart Pillows in two sizes. These heart pillows are one size for Breast Cancer patients, and the other size is for Heart Patients. We need only to cut them out and sew them up, leaving an opening for stuffing and once they are sewn, bring them in and give them to any QuiltFest Rep. The pillows will be stuffed at QuiltFest. They have asked for red or pink fabric. It does not have to be a solid.

The Me Dolls, once stuffed, will be given to the hospitals for the children. They use the dolls to draw on to explain to the children what they are going to do. The children get to keep the doll.

Ellen Cannon handed out some patterns for the heart pillows, to be taken home and used to make more patterns. Then the originals are to be returned to Pat.

Pat D'Elia told us that we are going to have Advance Tickets again this year. She sent around a clipboard so we could fill out the information, she'll bring the signup sheet again next month. Put down how many regular and how many senior tickets you need. The tickets will be purchased. Bring your money to the August meeting. A Rep from Quilt Fest will be here to sell us tickets.

You might volunteer one day and want to come back the next day. Buy an Advance Ticket for the second day or buy one for a friend or neighbor or relative. The reason for Advance Tickets

is because we don't want a bottle neck at the ticket window. We've had that happen before and we don't want to wait in line to buy a ticket on the day of. You need to get your ticket in advance. We are able to offer it, so take advantage of it. Pat passed around a signup sheet for advance tickets and she'll bring it again next month. These tickets are good for any day of the show.

Last year we had eleven quilt shops from Jacksonville, St. Augustine and Georgia selling advance tickets. This year the shops have formed a little challenge. QuiltFest offered a catered lunch to the shop that sells the most advance tickets. So, if you have a favorite quilt shop, you could buy your advance tickets there.

Silent Auction – Is a feature of QuiltFest that we have every year. The proceeds go to a charity This year we have 2 charities. One is Quigley House in Clay County and the other is The Betty Griffen House in St. Johns County. Both are safe havens for victims of domestic violence.

It is time to be making your Silent Auction items and looking to see what you may want to donate. Donations suggestions – if you are putting something in the boutique, make one for the silent auction. Bring donations items to Pat D'Elia.

Boutique - Deb Frain – 1 change – we won't be able to take pin cushions. We have a vendor that sells only pin cushions. We can, however, donate a scrap bag that has a pin cushion attached to it. She will have the forms for selling in the boutique and the tags and pins through the August meeting. She also has forms for Friends of QuiltFest. You can pick up a form and bring it back at the next meeting. It is \$5 per line, 52 characters per line, including spaces. Remember, this helps to pay for the free parking that is normally \$10 per day.

Samantha Howell has volunteered our Thursday sewing group to organize the two Raffle Baskets for Quilt Fest. The themes are "Coffee and Chocolate" and "In the Garden". She has put together a wish list on Amazon. Search her name and Quilt baskets. Some suggestions are — little biscotti's, coffee themed fabric, coasters, seed packets, hand tools, gloves, floral fabric.

Jenny Chambless – If anyone has ever wondered how you could be involved, then come volunteer for QuiltFest. It's only 2-hour slots. Go to the All Star website and in the upper right corner is a button "Quilt Fest Volunteer Signup" press that button, enter your name, email, etc., then scroll down to the calendar. Pick a day, and what you'd like to do. You can meet and connect with other people.

Quilt Sale Room - Ann has the Quilt Sales Room form if anyone needs one. They will take finished or unfinished quilts or projects. The only rule is that it cannot compete with the Boutique or any vendor.

Quilt of Valor – Randy Powers – Last Friday we presented 9 beautiful quilts. We presented to a 95-year-old, He lives with his daughter and son-in-law. He said, "Do not help me up the steps!". Tomorrow, Randy is being escorted onto the base here at Jacksonville. He will be presenting to a Lieutenant that served. She'll be presented with a beautiful quilt at the hospital. We have another one to present next Tuesday. That will be 12 quilts coming up.

Road Trip – Ellen Cannon – mark your calendar! Road trip on Thursday, July 24th to Oceans of Thread in Deland, FL. We'll meet at 9 am at the Target on San Jose (by Publix) at I295. There is also Carol's Quilt Shop further down HWY 17 in Deltona. It's about 15-20 minutes past Deland.

We'll talk more about it at the July General Meeting.

Sit-n-Stitch – LeighAnn McGuigan – There are two Sit-n-Stitch in June. One on the 23rd and one on the 30th. And another one on July 14 – bring friends, they can join us.

Ways and Means – Trisha Gros – 50/50 raffle. We collected \$111.00 today. The winner is Trish Egbert.

Extended Show and Tell – Pat D'Elia - 20 quilters showed us their quilts.
