## Featured Quilter - Deb Frain

You may know Deb Frain as one of the winners of this years' All Star Challenge. Or maybe you took her very successful class on rope baskets. I got to know Deb better when we shared a table at the All Star fall retreat a few years ago. (By the way, retreats are a great way to make new friends.) Deb is also a member of the 12 x 12 group. We are all impressed her talent! We are fortunate to have Deb in the Guild.

I will let Deb tell you about her quilting journey in her own words.

I'm originally from a farming community in south west Michigan then moved to Montana via St Louis, Missouri for nearly 20 years before retiring in Florida, 8 years ago.

My sewing journey began at 7 years old when my Aunt showed me a Singer hand crank sewing machine . . . I went from making doll clothes by hand to joining 4H and never looked back. My journey was clothing at the time and in high school I was lucky to get a job at "The Plaza Fabric Shoppe" to me this was like a kid in a candy store and I loved it!


