MINUTES of the JULY GENERAL MEETING

All Star Quilters' Guild General Meeting Minutes July 15th , 2024
President Sherry Verell called the meeting to order at 10:00 A.M.
Sherry stated that the minutes to the June General Meeting will be in the next newsletter.

The Guild is in need of a Ways and Means chairperson and an Education chairperson. Contact Sherry if you are interested.

The Guild received a request from Quilts of Valor for batting. Sherry made a motion for the Guild to purchase a roll of batting in the amount of \$120.00 for Quilts of Valor. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

Sherry announced that Sunnie Malesky will be the host of our Guild table at QuiltFest. Sherry passed around the sign-up sheet.

Vice President/Programs Sharon Tomore for Raney Manning announced that there is a sign-up sheet for tables at the August meeting sewing room sale. The scissor sharpening guy will be at the meeting. Scissors need to be dropped off before the meeting begins. At the August meeting, Raney will be passing out the cones for the "Tree -mendous" Holiday Meeting.

Treasurer Sharon Tomore gave her Treasurer's report. The beginning balance was \$9,941.73, income totaled \$220.41, expenses totaled \$212.22, the ending balance was \$9,949.92.

Corresponding Secretary Linda Harper sent out three cards this month. If a guild member needs a card, please let Linda know by e-mail.

QuiltFest Ellen Cannon for Pat D'Elia QuiltFest presale tickets will be available next month, Ellen passed around a sign-up sheet.

Education Pris Roehm stated that there are still openings for the July Featherweight Class and the August Hand Applique Class.

Featured Quilter/Quilts of Valor Linda Marsh stated that this month's featured quilter is Margaret Stewart. Linda thanked members for their donations to Quilts of Valor.

Fall Retreat Fall Retreat "Shining Stars" sign-ups will begin in August. The cost will be \$340.00. A deposit of \$75.00 is due when you sign-up.

note: *we are not allowing crochet or knit items and no wood or jewelry.*

Boutique Items to consider:

Kitchen & Household: aprons, placemats, potholders, dish towels, dish cozies, mug rugs, table cloths, napkins, decorator pillows, pillowcases, rope bowls, fabric bowls, tablet covers

Bags: purses, change purses, cosmetic bags, jewelry cases, tote bags, travel bags & Dopp kits, backpacks, curling iron bag, shoe bag, grocery bags, treat bag/holders

For Children: tooth fairy pillow, stuffed animals, dolls & clothes, bibs,

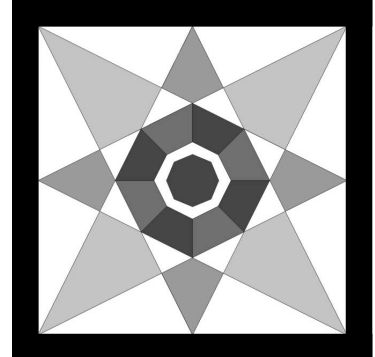
