MINUTES of the AUGUST GENERAL MEETING

All Star Quilters' Guild General Meeting Minutes August 19th , 2024.

President Sherry Verell called the meeting to order at 10:07 A.M.

Sherry asked if there were any changes to the June General Meeting Minutes. There were none. Sandra Kaye made a motion to accept the minutes as published. Mable Holiman seconded the motion. The minutes were accepted.

Sherry asked if there were any changes to the July General meeting Minutes. There were none. Trish Egbert made a motion to accept the minutes as published. Linda Harper seconded the motion. The minutes were accepted.

Sherry asked for volunteers for a **Nominating Committee**. Stacy Wilson, LeighAnn McGuigan and Linda Harper volunteered.

Sherry announced that we still need an education chair.

Karen Duffy has volunteered to take the Show and Tell pictures.

Sherry let the guild know that Foster Closet, our chosen charity for the 2024 raffle quilt proceeds is closing. Sherry stated that the board suggested the proceeds now go to Childhood Cancer Fund, (the charity that received the second most Guild member votes). Karol Bloomgren explained what the charity is all about. Karol encouraged members to buy raffle tickets. The Guild was asked to vote on the Childhood Cancer Fund being the recipient of the 2024 raffle quilt proceeds. **A vote was taken and the Guild approved the Childhood Cancer Fund being the recipient of the 2024 raffle quilt proceeds.**

Vice President Raney Manning stated that the upcoming programs are as follows: September – 12 x 12; October – MysteryBag Quilts; November – Applique Talk; December – “Tree – mendous” program. Next month Raney will hand out the trees to be decorated.

Treasurer Sharon Tomore gave her Treasurer's report. The beginning balance was \$9,317.19, income totaled \$272.50, expenses totaled \$475.64, the ending balance was \$9,114.05. Sharon requested that committee chairs submit their budgets for the upcoming year.

Corresponding Secretary/Free Table Linda Harper sent out three cards this month. The free table will be open at the September and October General Meeting.

If you have any pillow cases for Cases for Smiles please give them to Terry Chamberlain.

Community Service Joanne Davenport stated that Sharon Buquo needs 10 more quilts for Honor Flights. The baby quilt drive has almost met its goal. September is a Food Bank Drive month. If you need batting for a community service quilt, contact Joanne as Sharon is out of town.

Education Ellen Cannon stated that set up for the Hand Applique class begins at 8:45 A.M. It is an all-day class, so bring a lunch. Pris Roehm listed the supplies needed for class. Ellen stated that she needs two more volunteers for Demo Day.

Fall Retreat Sharon Tomore stated that there are 8 spaces open for Fall Retreat.

Featured Quilter Linda Marsh stated that Joanne Davenport is this month's Featured Quilter.

Hospitality Elfriede Echt thanked members who brought refreshments. She also thanked Jean Newton for setting the table.

Library Vicki Zoller stated that the library will be open next month. This month, some books are available for sale for \$1.00. Vicki encouraged members to purchase raffle tickets, explaining that some guilds strong arm their members into purchasing tickets.

Membership Susan Sharpe stated that we now have 179 members. 92 members and 2 guests are present today. Peggy Sarsfield and Sondie Frus are this month's drawing winners.

Newsletter Sunnie Malesky stated that the deadline for the newsletter is always midnight, the first Monday of the month.

Sunnie passed around the sign-up sheet for the Guild Table at QuiltFest, as we still need volunteers.

Publicity Sondie Frus displayed a QuiltFest car magnet that will be available. She encouraged members to invite their friends to QuiltFest. There will be a Selfie Booth at QuiltFest

QuiltFest Pat D'Elia stated that our guild has done a great job signing up to be a volunteer at QuiltFest. Pat listed some areas that still need volunteers. Ellen Cannon requested that if you need Boutique forms, see Deb Frain.

Quilts of Valor Samantha Howell thanked that guild for their donations of fabric, batting, and quilts. She will have kits available. Samantha, Linda Marsh and Randy Powers awarded 12 quilts last month.

Sit 'n Stitch LeighAnn McGuigan stated that there will be Sit 'n Stitches on September 9th , 23rd and 3 th .

Ways and Means Trish Gros requested that if you have any ideas, let her know. She is preparing a survey for next month.

Show and Tell Valerie Boufard Eleven members shared their quilts. The meeting was adjourned at 11:28 A.M.

FEATURED QUILTER By Linda Marsh

Sunnie Malesky is our Featured Quilter for September. She is originally from northeastern Ohio and has lived in many places within Ohio. She spent 1960-1961 in Miami as a first and second grader. In 1983 she lived in Dusseldorf, Germany. Sunnie has lived in the Jacksonville area since 1981, except for the one year she lived in Germany. She is married to Ed, her husband of 49 years. He is an artist working in turned wood and other media.



Sunnie has been quilting since 1981, but has sewn since high school. Sunnie's quilting experience is self-taught from watching TV shows, and reading books and magazines.

The first quilt Sunnie made was inspired by seeing a Jean Ray Laury quilt on the front of Crafts magazine. So, when friends announced they were having a baby, she designed a quilt with appliques of items that had meaning to her expecting friends and herself. It was satin-stitched quilt-as-you-go.

When All Stars guild formed in January of 1989, Sunnie was invited by a librarian at the Kori Road library to join the guild. She had another obligation on Monday mornings, but when her prior obligation ended after 5 months, she was able to join All Stars. She has learned many life-skills by being a guild member, not just quilting. There are so many things to do to in running our wonderful group, that she wishes more members would take on just one of the smaller or temporary jobs so they could enjoy working with and getting to know other members.

Other hobbies/talents that Sunnie enjoys are making journals and other books, growing succulents, and going to lunch.

Sunnie enjoys designing her own quilts, and uses many different fabrics. For instance, if she needs the color blue, she will use 5 or 6 blues, and not just one. Sunnie has entered some of her quilts in shows, and believes entering quilt shows provides great thrill and self-validation from seeing your own quilt in a show. Sunnie has won a Presidents' award for a Challenge, and two Judge's Recognitions. Many of the names for her quilts come from funny things a friend has said, such as Perky Old Men and Roxanne's Honeymoon.

Sunnie is also a member of Studio Art Quilt Associates and a Charter AQS member.

Blocks range in size from 5" to 7" but you could enlarge the patterns to make larger blocks. There are twisted blocks, wonky blocks, heart blocks and more. If you like paper piecing and are looking to expand your knowledge of log cabin blocks, this book is for you. As an aside, this book must have written itself, as there is no author listed on the book!

Kaffe Fassett books are the most popular ones in the Guild library. Little Patchworks contains everything from mini quilts to an apron to a tote bag to a shawl. Maybe you picked up some fabric at the Sewing Room Sale that would be perfect for one or more of these projects. Even if you do not intend to make any of the items, it is always a fun to look at projects made with Kaffe Fassett's colorful fabrics.

note: *we are not allowing crochet or knit items and no wood or jewelry.*

Boutique Items to consider:

Kitchen & Household: aprons, placemats, potholders, dish towels, dish cozies, mug rugs, table cloths, napkins, decorator pillows, pillowcases, rope bowls, fabric bowls, tablet covers

For Children: tooth fairy pillow, stuffed animals, dolls & clothes, bibs,

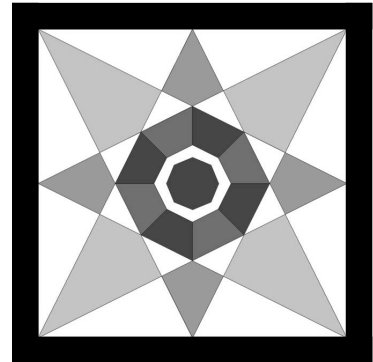
