Featured Quilter – Diana Oliver

Our June Featured Quilter is Diana Oliver. Diana was born into a military family and first moved when she was 10 days old. After that, she lived in 15 different locations in the U.S. and also lived in Europe. For the past 30 years, Diana calls Jacksonville her home.



Diana first sewed satin squares together as a teenager in her first attempt to make a quilt. That quilt was never finished. When she was between jobs, she took a quilting class at FSCJ, and then made several quilts before returning to the workforce. She did not quilt again until she retired 2-3 years ago.

Diana knew about All Stars 20+ years ago when her class instructor at FSCJ mentioned All Stars to her. She stopped at the All Stars table at QuiltFest about 3 years ago and joined. She says she was pleasantly surprised at the professional structure of the All Star meetings and friendliness of its members. She enjoys having many activities to get involved in, but no pressure to do everything.

During Covid, Diana made cloth masks for going to the grocery store. The only fabric she still owned were scraps left over from years ago when she made her then 3-4 year old daughter a butterfly applique quilt. The masks she made were all very bright colors with psychedelic patterns previously used for the butterfly wings.

Membership

Susan Sharpe – 89 people are present today + 1 guest, Diane Klingbeil (guest of Cindy Magee). No new members today. Total members 155.

T-shirts – half of this has been done by Trisha Gros who did the research for T-shirts. Susan thinks that they can combine the two into the same manufacturer, if Trisha is not too far along in the process.

Susan passed out 2 clip boards – one for the old design and one for the new design. Sign up on the list for the design you want.

There are 2 designs – Crew - 61 colors, these run true to size, and the V-neck - 11 colors, these run up to 2 sizes smaller. Crew and V-Neck are \$20 each. Long Sleeve will be \$23 each. They are still working on the colors.

A new design was introduced – Yellow star in the middle. The shirts are available in yellow, navy, pink, grey and aqua.

Changes can be made if we stick to 1 vendor. No money will be asked for until we get them in. Susan said that she thinks she'll do her "5200, 1-inch squares, "Never Again Quilt" again.

Starting at our May Guild meeting **see Deb Frain, our guild’s contact to pick up your entry and information forms** as well as answer any questions you may have. These forms will be available at all our Guild meetings from May till August.

Note: Many of the items last year were purchased for gifts and the colorful eye-catching ones sold very well. We are **not** allowing crochet or knit items.

Below is a list of “some” items that would be good for the Boutique. Whether its hand sewn or a sewing machine has been used to make it, then you are probably OK.

Boutique Items to consider:

Kitchen & Household: aprons, placemats, potholders, dish towels, dish cozies, mug rugs, napkins, decorator pillows, pillowcases, rope bowls, fabric bowls, tablet covers.
