Congratulations to Marita Eng, Sondie Frus, Ellen Cannon and Lynn McCrork, winners of this year's Guild Challenge, Two with a Twist. Also, a big thank you to assistants Linda McClelland, and Mary Anne Dennis, and vote counters Ellen Ford and Valerie Broussard.

The turnout for the Challenge was amazing-- 26 entries! That is the most since the Monogram Challenge. Quilters not only rose to the challenge of using two colors chosen at random, but also excelled at using many different techniques. We saw original designs, appliqué, piecing, thread work, hand quilting, innovative piecing and quilting in one step, an imaginative use of yo yos, writing on fabric, hand colored fabric, various finishing techniques, and probably some more that I can't remember!

Almost as much fun as looking at the quilts was hearing the stories behind them. We really take notice of all the nuances in each special quilt when the quilter shares the story of the her work with us. Great work, everyone!

I hope to see many of these quilts at QuiltFest, whether entered in the show or as part of the Silent Auction. We also want to take the winning quilts to Friendship Guild for our exchange program (the date is still not set) to share your work with them.

All Star Quilters' Guild -Where everyone can shine!



Let's get to know Roberta "Bobbie" Redshaw a bit better. She is a proud member of New Hanover High School in Wilmington, North Carolina while living at Wrightsville Beach. She has also lived in Illinois, New Jersey and Virginia. She moved to Jacksonville, Florida in 1961.

Her journey to quilting is similar to many of us. Bobbie has been quilting for about 4 years. Her mom was a seamstress, so she has been sewing since childhood. She made all of her clothes and her daughter's clothes when she was growing up. Her daughter has been quilting for about 25 years and she and her friend Pam (ABC Sewing Center) had tried for years to get her to start quilting, with no luck.

Bobbie would take her crocheting project and go to her daughter's and friends quilting night. While they worked on their projects she would crochet. And of course, they always had plenty to eat. Bobbie says when she listened to all of them talking about how long they had been working on a project (some of them took years) and how many they had going at a time, she didn't think this was for her. When she started a project, she liked to finish it in a short time.

She went to visit them at their local quilt retreat about four years ago and was hooked. She makes mostly childrens charity quilts. We have a group of quilters who gather at Fort Caroline Community Church, where they always end up with a Wounded Warrior Quilt to donate. Last year she had a quilt in Quiltfest.

Bobbie retired from Barnett Bank after 31 years, but still worked part time at Hampton Inn. She worked Meals on Wheels 3 days a month out of two different churches for 15 years.

Bobbie says the hardest part of learning to quilt was learning the language and reading the patterns. All of it is so different then sewing. She says she did learn quilting is not a cheap hobby. She has quilting friends that have large stashes that tell here to come shopping at their house before going to the store. She invested in a sit-down quilting machine and enjoys quilting for charity and friends. Many of her quilt group belongs to All Stars and invite me to join. Bobbie says she enjoys the friendships and learning new things.

Bobbie has a daughter who is an elementary Art teacher. She has visited All Stars several times and will be joining when she retires after the next school year. She has 3 children and 7 grand children and 1 great grand child.

When asked, "what must people don't know" – Bobbie said after high school she joined the Air Force (1956) and was a flight attendant on a Military Air Transport Service.

QuiltFest 2019

QUILTFEST 2019
September 19-21, 2019
“Bobbin on the Beach”

At the June 18 QuiltFest board meeting, board members finalized some plans to make QuiltFest more visible in the community and to increase revenue.

Because it was felt that many people might be confused by the title “QuiltFest,” this year’s show will be rebranded slightly as Jacksonville Quilt Show sponsored by QuiltFest, Inc. Other decisions made include the following:

- The admission fee for the show will be increased to \$12.
- For the first time, QuiltFest will begin accepting credit cards at the Quilt Sale table and QuiltFest table.
- Space for the Quilt Sale table will be expanded so that it is easier to view the quilts for sale and so that shoppers don’t have to sort through large piles of quilts. In addition, the amount kept by QuiltFest for each individual’s total sales will be increased from ten percent to 15 percent. The number of quilts each quilter can enter for sale has been increased to 20 per person. Krista Cline with Coastal Quilters is coordinating this activity, and more information about volunteering to work at the Quilt Sale table will be available at a later date.
- The price for challenge packets for the 2020 show will be increased to \$20.

The success of QuiltFest depends on its volunteers. At the June 17 Guild meeting we began taking signups for volunteers to work during QuiltFest. I am coordinating all volunteers for QuiltFest, and Mary Anne Dennis is coordinating volunteer signups for our Guild. The greatest need for volunteers is for Judging (Sunday, September 8, through Wednesday, September 11), Show Hostess (also known as White Glove), the Community Service table (a sit-down job) where pillow cases and Me Dolls are sewn, the Guild Outreach table (another sit-down job), Hanging (on Tuesday, September 17) and Take Down (on Saturday, September 21 after the show). Training for these last two volunteer positions will be provided. By the way, if you're interested in learning how quilts are judged, and in getting an advance look at the winning quilts, volunteer to help at judging. I participated for the first-time last year, and it was a great learning experience.

Last year, All Stars had 60 volunteers, the most of any guild. Let's make this year even better. Remember, with the exception of the Guild table where our raffle quilt is sold, if you volunteer at QuiltFest you will get into the show free on the day(s) you volunteer.

Some reminders from previous newsletters:

- The deadline for entering a quilt (or quilts) in QuiltFest is fast approaching -- your registration form must be postmarked by July 25. The entry fee is \$15 per quilt for members of the seven local guilds and \$18 for non-guild members. Each entry requires a separate registration form and entry fee. The entry form is on line at the web site, QuiltFest, Inc. Click on the link -- Enter A Quilt -- to print out forms. I also have entry forms, and if you need one (or more), please send me an e-mail at kandsmom1959@gmail.com, and I will see that you get a form. I will also have entry forms available at the July 15 Guild meeting.
- The QuiltFest Community Service table needs fabric for pillowcases and Me Dolls, as well as fiberfill to be used to stuff the Me Dolls. The pillowcases and Me Dolls are sewn by volunteers at the Community Service table during the show and donated to charitable causes. If you have juvenile print fabric you would like to donate, you can give it to one of the All Stars representatives on the QuiltFest board: June Daniels, Mary Jeanette Howle, Susan Sharpe, Linda Wilson, Ellen Ford or Ronni Potter. We will see that the fabric is delivered, and thanks in advance for your contribution.
- Take-in for the show is September 7 at the church
- All Stars' assigned time to work the Quilt Sale table is Thursday morning, September 21 (the first day of the show), from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM. In previous years, our time was Thursday afternoon.
- This year, All Stars will sponsor the Best in Show category (the award is \$300), Best Hand Quilting (\$100 award) and Best Machine Quilting (\$100 award).

- Guild Table – At a future Guild meeting, Pat D’Elia and her Ways and Means committee will be taking signups to work at the Guild table. This table is where we sell chances for the Guild’s raffle quilt and answer questions about All Stars. Volunteers work two-hour shifts during the show. **NOTE:** This volunteer position does not include free admission to the show. Pat will have more information about signups to work at the Guild table at a later date.
- Quilters Walk - Kathi Thompson is collecting civil war fabrics – fat quarters and larger – to be given away along with a tote bag that she has made to be donated by All Stars. Kathi has said that if the tote bag gets filled up, and donations are still coming in, she will make another tote bag. Please give your contributions to Kathi at the Guild meetings.
- Guild Community Outreach – Roberta Redshaw is working on this important display which will showcase our Guild’s charitable and community service projects. If you are interested in working at this table (a sit-down job) during QuiltFest, you can sign up on the volunteer form.

The next QuiltFest Board meeting is at 7:00 PM on Tuesday, July 16, at 7:00 PM at the Lexington Hotel on the Southbank. Visitors are always welcome. If you are interested in attending to learn more about how QuiltFest is organized and staged, please talk to one of the All Stars QuiltFest Board representatives listed above for more information.

Save the Date: August 12 Doll Clothes Day

Come to Sit & Stitch August 12 to make doll clothes for one of the Guild's charities, Sophie's Circle. Sophie's Circle collects doll clothes for 18" American Girl style dolls that are given to girls who are being adopted into a new family.

What if you have never sewn doll clothes before? No worries-- I have chosen a really cute, simple pattern that doesn't have zippers, snaps, buttons, or Velcro. The sundress pictured uses ribbons as closures. You don't have to bring fabric or cut out the dress. I have made up kits with fabric and ribbon. See that pocket on the dress? You don't have to do that either. Some of kits have pockets ribbon embellishments, or appliqués already sewn on.

What you need to bring is your sewing machine, various colored threads, and basic sewing supplies. I will walk you through the steps to make this dress. Any questions? Just email me. hope to see you August 12 at Sit & Stitch!

UFO Challenge

At the June 17 All Stars Guild meeting, four members displayed four completed UFOs and four completed quilt tops.

Sherry Verell showed “Cherry Playtime,” a turquoise and red quilt made with jelly roll strips, that she started in 2014.

Lynne McCrork displayed two finished quilts: “Lucky Stars” is a brown and pink quilt started in 2016. Lynne says she bought the kit and pattern at Quilt Shop of Deland while on a shop hop. She then decided to make the quilt larger and bought additional fabric at Cinnamon’s. She finished the top at Ridgetop Quilters Lodge in North Carolina in July 2016 and then completed the quilt this year.

Lynne’s second quilt was a Row of the Month quilt that she started in 2017. The quilt will be hung in the quilting room at her church.

Bonnie Helm showed four quilt tops: a batik square-in-a-square quilt top started in 2016, using blues and greens from layer cakes and strip sets; an Eiffel Tower panel started in 2017; a butterfly quilt top using several butterfly fabrics and started in 2016; and a floral quilt top that was probably started in the 1970s.

Trish Egbert’s completed quilt was a children’s quilt using red fabrics. Trish stated that the quilt was a community service project.

Remember that the criteria for UFOs are that the quilt should have been started in 2017 or earlier, and the UFO quilts should be completed when they are displayed. For each completed UFO you enter, your name will be entered for a drawing that will take place at the end of the year (e.g., if you complete ten UFOs, your name will be entered ten times).

You still have time to take part in this activity. Mary Anne Dennis will have the forms you can use to list your UFOs at the July 16 Guild meeting. For each quilt you complete you will receive a sticker designed by Andrea Pellegrino. See how many stickers you can collect by the end of this challenge. We’re looking forward to seeing the next group of UFOs completed by our talented members.
