## **All Star Quilters' Guild Featured Quilter We're looking for.....you!!!**

I've been passing on Featured Quilters great stories for 7 years now. Before that, Vicki Zoller started the ball rolling and Linda Wilson took a turn. I do believe we need to pass the assignments around, and I've kept this one too long because I've enjoyed it so much. Now it is time for someone else to serve the guild and have fun doing it. It would be nice if someone who does not already have a service position would volunteer. I maintain it is the easiest task in the guild, and you don't have to attend any extra meetings or be anywhere. You do it from home at your convenience. You don't have to know anyone (but you'll get to know them!) Here's how it goes:

1. Choose a person to be your next Featured Quilter. I always say, everyone has a story—and I believe that! I get an idea for someone who shows a quilt at sew and tell, or I sit next to them at a sit and stitch or class, or I see their picture in the directory. Usually right after the general meeting I email them. Most are delighted!

2. The email says I'd like them to be a FQ. I have a list of questions (you can tweak my list any way you like) in the email and ask them to respond by email, or even hand write it out if they prefer. I remind them the deadline is the first of the month, in time for the newsletter. I save my email so that I just cut and paste it each month. Takes 5 minutes tops!

3. When they respond I edit it slightly as necessary—mostly just making it third person. (“she”, not “I”). Dear Ellen, the newsletter editor, pulls the picture up for the newsletter if available, I don't even have to do that. All I do is send Ellen my email interview before the beginning of the month. Takes me maybe 20 minutes.

4. At the General Meeting I announce the Featured Quilter and usually say a bit about her or ask the group what caught their eye when they read it. And they do read it! It has been a custom that we give the FQ a little something. Not necessary, but a nice gesture. I give them a mug rug, because that's what I like making! It could be a store-bought star, a la All Stars (hmm, a star cookie cutter with a bow?) or a mini quilt like Joyce makes. Something quick and easy.

I know there's someone (maybe more than one) person out there that would fit this opportunity to a T. Let me know at the meeting or my email ([Lgm1249@gmail.com](mailto:Lgm1249@gmail.com)) or phone 904-651-7032.

## **QuiltFest**

On October 5, the QuiltFest Board of Directors met to review the 2019 show and to identify areas where changes and improvements could be made. These discussions were continued at the October 15 Board meeting, and the following initiatives were identified that will be started immediately:

- **Web Redesign:** The QuiltFest website will be completely redesigned to make it more informative, modern and user friendly.
- **Board Presentations to Guilds:** The Board is going to go to each guild belonging to the Seven Sisters Guilds to update the guilds on the status of the QuiltFest. This will include the financial status and proposed changes to the show to broaden its appeal.
- **Expansion Review:** Addition of (non-quilt) categories such as needle arts and fiber arts will be considered. It is believed this will help attract artists who are not quilters.

This year, for the first time, credit cards were accepted at the quilt sale table. Of the total sales, of \$12,978, 69%, or \$9,001, were credit card sales.

For 2020, the Program Table that has been in the lobby outside the ticket sale booth will be eliminated. Instead, show attendees will be given their programs as they enter the show through the turnstile. The programs will no longer contain door prize stamps.

The Guild Outreach volunteer position is also being eliminated. Instead, the display boards will be shown at each guild's table where tickets for the raffle quilts are sold. If show attendees have questions about the information displayed on the boards, guild members will be available to answer them.

This next year will be a busy one for the QuiltFest Board as we work to streamline, modernize and improve QuiltFest. The next QuiltFest Board meeting is on Tuesday, November 18, at 7:00 PM at the Lexington Hotel on the Southbank. ## **UFO Challenge**

November is the last month for the 2019 UFO Challenge, so if you still have uncompleted projects on your UFO list, time is running out.
